Air Academy Mountain Bike Team Wins Division 1 Colorado High School Mountain Bike League "Lazy Ranch Rally" in Fountain, Colorado

Air Academy, for the third time in a row took first place in another Colorado High School League regional race. This week, the action took place at Fountain Valley High School near Fountain Colorado. The racecourse was deceivingly hard. It was relatively flat with no big climbs which made for a blistering fast course with no opportunity for recovery combined with high wind exposure.

Freshmen Boys: The Freshmen boys started the day off racing two laps of the approximately 6.5-mile course. A group of four separated themselves from the rest of the field with a chase group forming 10 seconds behind. Air Academy riders Chase McAfee and Dylan Hudson came through on the first lap towing two Taos NM riders in a tight pack. Chase led the group to the second lap then crashed. He recovered quickly and became a lone chaser fighting a stiff head wind. Dylan Hudson was able to open a 30 second gap on the two Taos riders before crashing 200 meters from the finish line. He was quickly back on his bike crossing the line 12 seconds ahead of the Taos riders. Chase followed at 30 seconds for fourth.

Sophomore Boys: A starting field of 52 Sophomore boys were next. Jackson Lorigan led the way for Air Academy finishing 11th, just 6 seconds from the top ten. Jacob Lane was next at 31st place after crashing twice during the second lap. Alex Winslow rounded out the Air Academy sophomore boys rolling in at 39th.

These riders continued to battle back and forth throughout the second lap until Justin was able to attack and open a six second lead which he held to the finish, taking first place. Charley Weitz was the next Air Academy rider at 49th with Creed Anderson just seconds behind at 59th. Conner Pietrzak rounded out Air Academy JV boys at 70th.

The wind and pace took its toll, and the lead pack was whittled down to four by the end of the second lap. Austin picked up the pace on the third lap resulting in the fastest lap of the day, opening 10 seconds on Jack Higley of Thunder Ridge to take the win. Zim Reichart (11th), Keegan Hale (13th), and Jacob Weber (19th) had excellent races to place four AA riders in the top 20. Keenan Swanson (37), Eli Rawe (38), Cooper Markley (40), Trevor Kornmesser (42), Braun Deighton (43), and Simeon Scheid (45) all finished within minutes in a very competitive field. Alex remained calm while the rest of the field rode away. It took approximately eight minutes to replace the chain plus a 5minute penalty for receiving outside assistance.
