## Air Academy Mountain Bike Team is the Colorado High School League Division 1 Regional Champions

The Air Academy Mountain Bike Team traveled to Nathrop Colorado to compete in the "Chalk Creek Stampede", the fourth and final race of the Colorado High School League regional series. The Stampede proved to be a challenging course. The 6.7-mile lap climbed out of the valley to the top of a ridge on a double track dirt road that turned to single track with tight switchbacks. The course continued along the ridge on rocky single track lined with cactus for approximately three miles. A technical descent led to a lush valley with fast flowing singletrack along Chalk Creek. Another climb out of the valley then a mix of single track and dirt road that gradually descended to a drag race finish. As with all the league races, freshmen, sophomore, and JV raced two laps, and varsity three.

On the second lap, Sandrine attacked on the main climb and gradually opened a gap on the Crested Butte and Manitou Springs riders and continued to increase her lead, finishing second overall and 21 seconds ahead of third place.

Varsity Boys: Air Academy has one of the highest if not the highest team percentage of racers in the varsity boy's category. Over 1/3 of the team and 11 of the 21 boys race varsity. This is a category that one must qualify for by being among the fastest in the league. There are no slow racers in the varsity category. The varsity boys' race, as always got off to an incredibly fast start. A tight lead pack of five rounded the first lap with Air Academy's Austin Leigh in the mix. All were within hundredths of a second of each other. The situation was the same at the end of the second lap. On the third lap, Austin attacked and the only one that could go with him was Thunder Ridge's Jack Higley. In the end, it was an all-out sprint over the last mile with Jack Higley taking the checkered flag and Austin, for the first time this year, settling for second. Alex Snyder started in 37<sup>th</sup> position and raced three very fast and consistent laps making up 30 spots to finish 7<sup>th</sup>. Zim Reichart finished just behind at 12<sup>th</sup> with Keegan Hale coming in at 14<sup>th</sup> placing four Air Academy riders in the top 15. Trevor Kornmesser and Jacob Weber worked together to come in at 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup>. **Varsity Girls:** The last race of the day, the varsity girls started fast and furious. Like the boys' varsity, these girls must qualify by being among the fastest in the state.
